

Geofry

Githongoro is one of the most deprived areas of Nairobi, this is where Geofry lives and attends Compassion School. Geofry was born in July 2013.

Every 6 months the children are all given a dose of albendazole to combat Soil Transmitted Helminthiasis (STH), one Neglected Tropical Disease that is simple to treat but has wide spread effects. Almost a quarter of the worlds population are infected at any one time, the majority are young children and particularly those living where sanitation is poor and open defecation occurs.

A young child like Geofry, can become **physically**, **nutritionally** and **cognitively impaired** when frequently reinfected by **STH**. This happens because the worms feed on host tissues, including blood, which leads to a loss of iron and protein and poor

absorption of vital nutrients.

Porridge and Rice follows the WHO strategy for controlling STH:



- health and hygiene education to reduce transmission and reinfection by encouraging healthy behaviours; and
- provision of adequate sanitation such as hand washing facilities.

Albendazole is donated to the ministry of health through the WHO, however, they do not always reach the children in informal schools where they are needed most. **Porridge and Rice** works with the

health authorities to distribute the medicines and improve the health of the children.

Geofry was once on the **3**rd, the lowest percentile, for his height and weight, after **sustained nutrition** and regular **treatment for STH**, he now sits on the **25**th.
